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CHARTER CODE OF CONDUCT FOR Rap-Aid Youth Football Club

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of Rap-Aid Youth Football Club are to include the development of self-discipline, self-confidence, physical fitness, good citizenship, and sound character. We seek to bring our youth and our community closer together through the means of a common interest in sportsmanship, fair play and friendship. We seek to provide a fun, safe and supervised environment for our young people to learn the proper techniques of football and cheer. At all times, we seek to keep welfare of the children first and foremost.

To achieve our objectives, all adults connected with or who participate in Rap-Aid Youth Football Club must adhere to the following standards of conduct as it pertains to any interaction with coaches, football players, officials, board members and staff, and other parents involved in the program. By registering a child for whom you are the responsible adult, you agree that you and all other responsible adults associated with your child, will abide by the Code of Conduct.

Please read the Code of Conduct and acknowledge your agreement by signing below. Your child will not be considered registered without an acceptance acknowledgement on our Membership Form acknowledgement.

Codes of Conduct

A Code of Conduct for Football

Football is a national game. All those involved in the game at every level and whether as a player, match official, coach, owner or administrator, have a responsibility, above and beyond the compliance with the law, to act accordingly to the highest standards of integrity, and to ensure that the reputation of the game is, and remains, high.

Community

Football, at all levels, is a vital part of a community. Football will take into account community feeling when making decisions.

Equality

Football is opposed to discrimination of any form and will promote measures to prevent it, in whatever form, from being expressed.



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Respect for the Laws of the Game and competition rules

A player should:

1. Make every effort to develop their own sporting abilities, in terms of skill, technique, tactics and stamina.
2. Give maximum effort and strive for the best possible performance during a game, even if his team is in a position where the desired result has already been achieved.
3. Set a positive example for others, particularly younger players and supporters.
4. Avoid all forms of gamesmanship, and time-wasting.
5. Always have regard to the best interests of the game, including where publicly expressing an opinion on the game and any particular aspect of it, including others involved in the game.
6. Not use inappropriate language.
7. Wear the appropriate football kits for all games.
8. Always be on time for football training and football matches (both home & away matches).

Obligation towards one's team

A player should:

1. Make every effort consistent with Fair Play and the Laws of the Game to help his own team win.
2. Resist any influence which might, or might be seen to, bring into question his commitment to the team winning.

Respect for the laws of the game and competition rules

A player should:

1. Know and abide by the Laws, rules and spirit of the game, and the competition rules.
2. Accept success and failure, victory and defeat, equally.
3. Resist any temptation to take banned substances or use banned techniques.
4. Play Fairly, I won't cheat, complain or waste time.

Respect towards opponents

A player should:

1. Treat opponents with due respect at all times, irrespective of the result of the game.
2. Safeguard the physical fitness of opponents, avoid violence and rough play, and help injured opponents.



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Respect towards the match officials

A player should:

1. Accept the decision of the Match Official without protest.
2. Avoid words or actions which may mislead a Match Official.
3. Show due respect towards Match Officials.
4. Always shake hands at the end of every game

Respect towards the team officials

A player should;

1. Abide by the instructions of their Coach and Team Officials. provided they do not contradict the spirit of this code
2. Show due respect towards the Coaches and Team Officials of the opposition.

Obligation towards the supporters

A player should:

1. Show due respect to the interests of supporters.

Fines

Any fines handed down by the FA or league and incurred by the team as a result of a player's action will be payable by the player or parent of the player.

Any fine incurred for dissent or violent conduct will be doubled by the club

Ban / Suspensions

Any ban / suspension handed down by the FA to a player for dissent will be increased by the club by a minimum of 1 additional game and any further additional bans will be agreed with Coach / Manager and the club discipline secretary.

Code of Conduct for Parents and Spectators

Parents and Spectators have a great influence on children's enjoyment and success in football. All children play football because they first and foremost love the game – its fun. Parents are responsible for bringing to every match and training any essential medication ie inhalers.

It is important to remember that however good a child becomes at football, Rap-Aid Youth Football Club feel that it is important to reinforce the message that positive encouragement will contribute to:

- ❖ Children enjoying football
- ❖ A sense of personal achievement
- ❖ Self esteem
- ❖ Improving the child's skills and techniques.



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Parents and Spectators expectations and attitudes have a significant bearing in a child's attitude towards:

- ❖ **Other players**
- ❖ **Officials**
- ❖ **Managers**
- ❖ **Spectators**

Parents and Spectators should always be positive and encouraging towards all of the children not just their own by:

- ❖ Applauding the opposition as well as your own team
- ❖ Avoid criticizing a player for making a mistake- they are part of learning.
- ❖ Avoid coaching a child during the game
- ❖ Not to shout and scream
- ❖ Respect the Match Officials decisions and encourage the players to do so.
- ❖ Give attention to each of the children involved in football not just the most talented
- ❖ Give encouragement to everyone to participate in football.

Parents and Spectators should show respect towards your Childs Team Managers and Coaches. These people give up their time voluntarily to coach and support your children. Please speak to your Team Manager first if any issues arrive. If you are not happy with the outcome, please follow our Complaints procedure, details on our website. Any Parents or Spectators who are shown to be disregarding our rules by their behavior may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club, league or County FA Welfare Officer
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have the club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents

In addition

The FA/ County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club
